- 1) No student shall be eligible to take the examination unless he has completed 75% of attendance counted from the opening of class up to the 1st of the month preceding the month in which the examination commences in the subjects of internal assessment.

Q 10. One out of two Long Answer type Questions from **FIRST FLIGHT** to be answered In about 100-150 words to assess creativity, imagination and extrapolation beyond the text and across the texts.

Q 11. One out of two Long Answer Questions from the book **FOOTPRINTS without FEET** on Theme or plot involving interpretation, extrapolation beyond the text and inference or Character sketch to be answered in about (100-150words)

[8 marks]

Reading Section: Reading for comprehension, critical evaluation, inference and analysis are skilled to be tested.

Writing Section: All types of short and extended writing tasks will be dealt with,

Grammar : Grammar items mentioned in the syllabus will be taught and assessed over a period of time. There will be no division of syllabus for Grammar.

Assessment of Listening and Speaking Skills:-

50 Periods

Assessment of Listening and Speaking Skills will be for 05 marks. It is recommended that listening and speaking skills should be regularly practiced in the class. Art-integrated activities like Role Play, Skit, Dramatization etc. can also be used.
