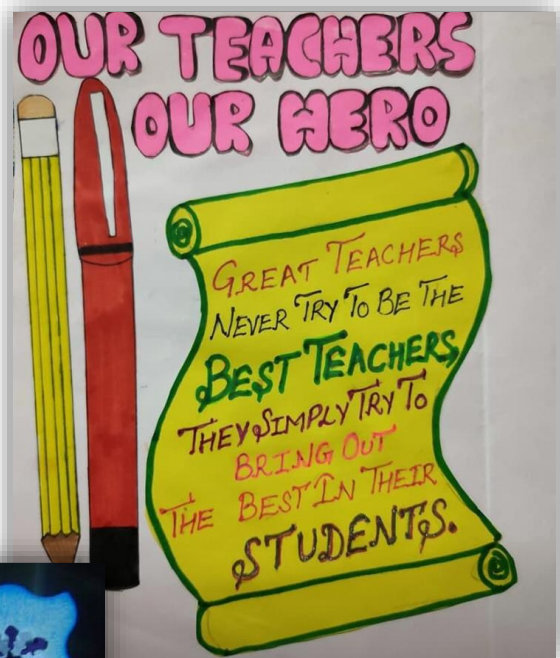
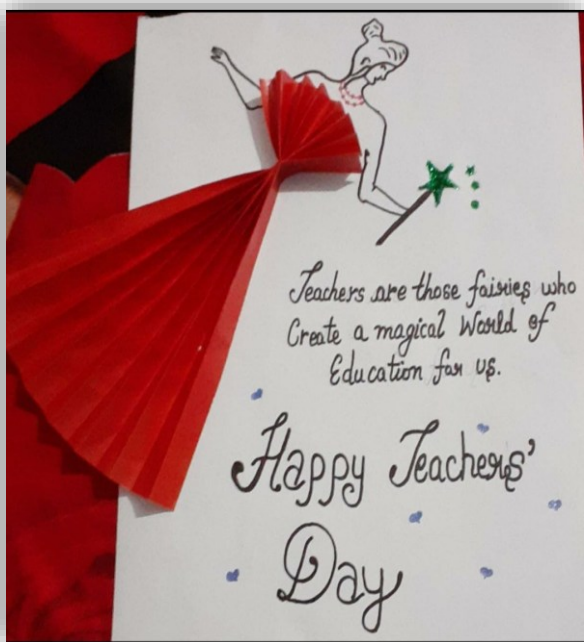
### Details of different activities conducted during the year –

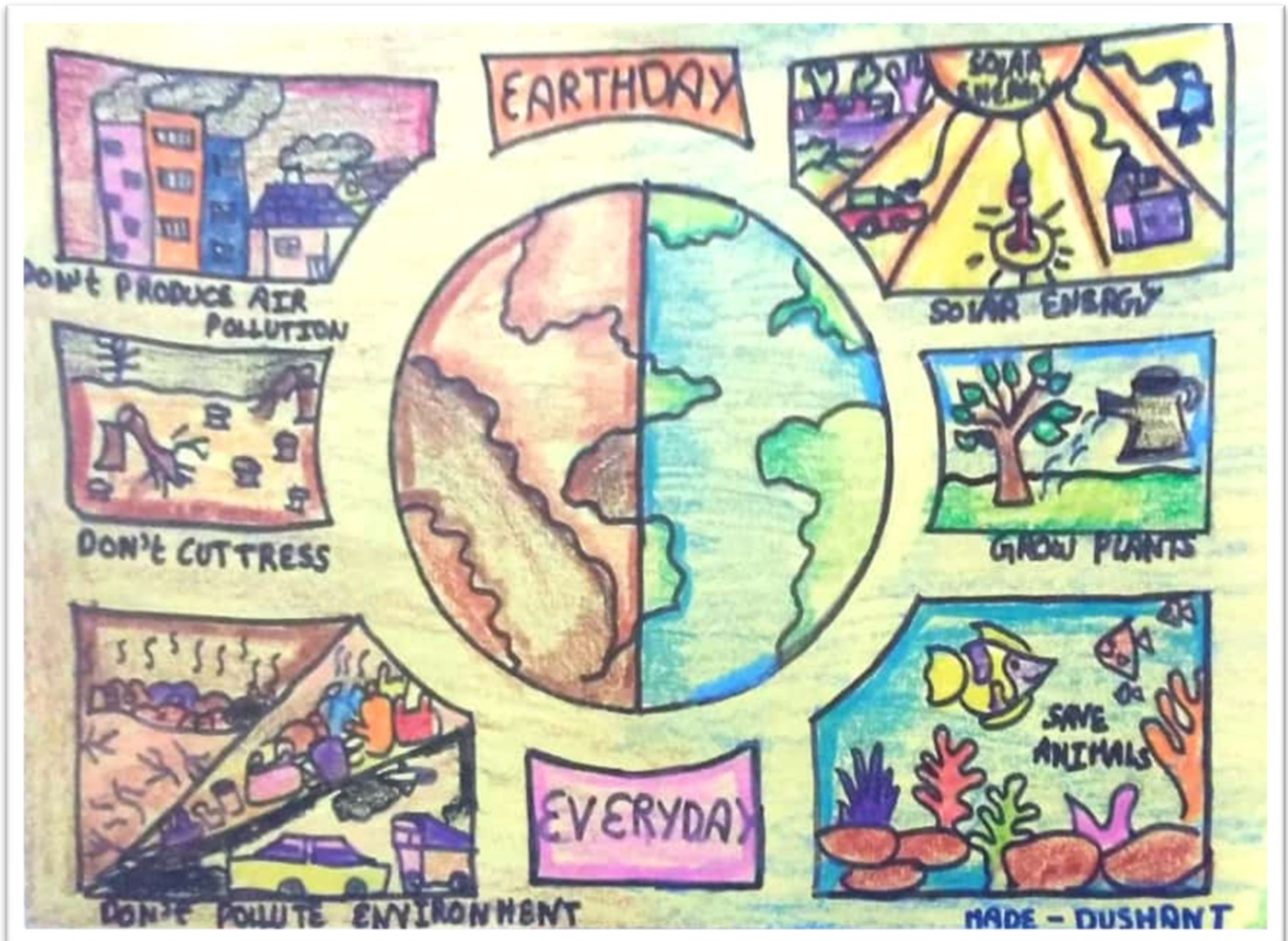
1. We tried to create awareness through poster etc. on world water day.
